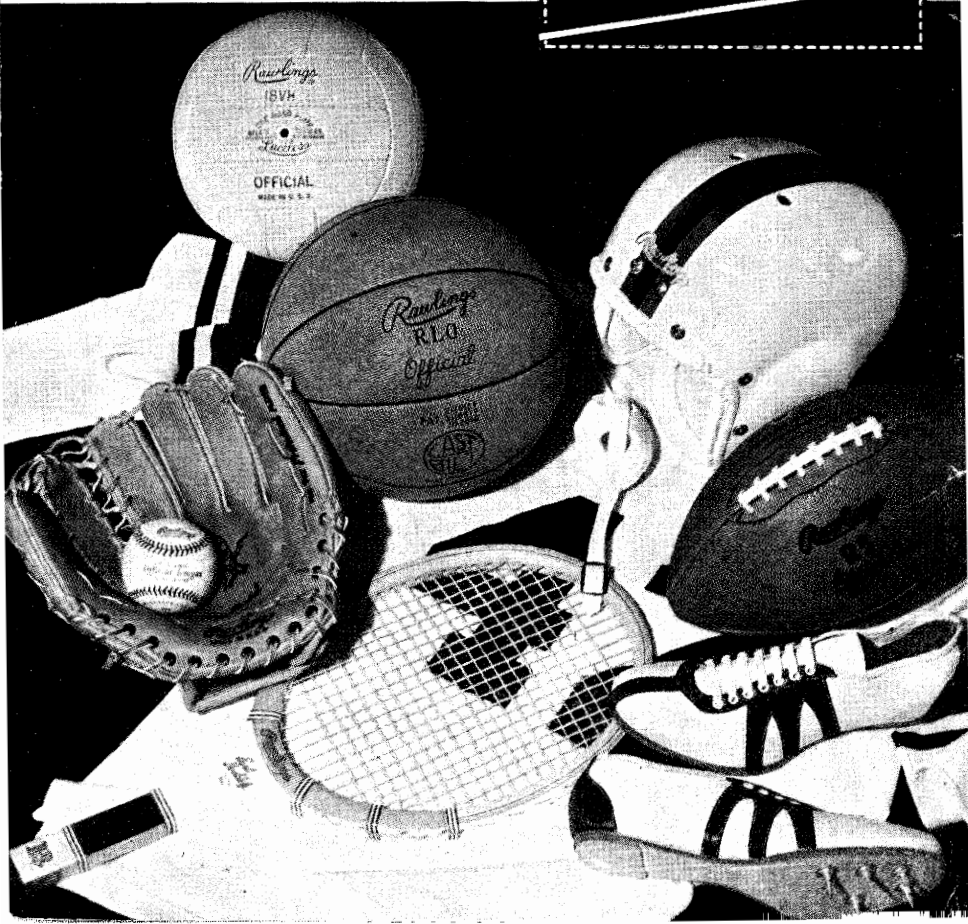
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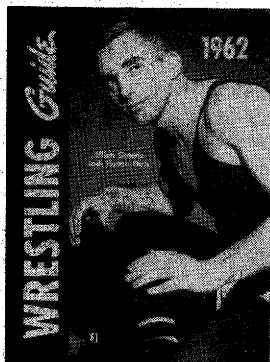

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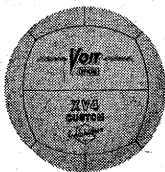
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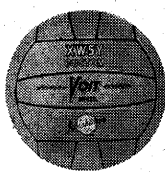
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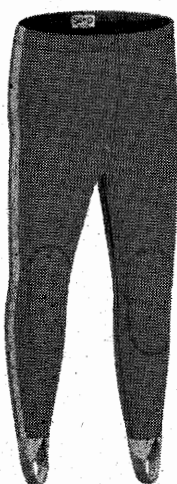

National Collegiate Championships

It was the state of Oklahoma versus the rest of the nation at the 31st annual National Collegiate Wrestling Championships—held for the first time on the Pacific Coast, with Oregon State University as host institution.

Oklahoma State's Cowboys swept to their twenty-second National Collegiate team crown in the three-day affair, piling up 82 points to dethrone defending titlist University of Oklahoma. The Sooners finished second with 63 points as the two Oklahoma schools dominated proceedings in the three-day affair.

Oregon State thrilled home-town Corvallis fans by ending up in fourth place, just one point behind third-place finisher Iowa State. It was the highest placing ever in the NCAA event for a West Coast contingent.

Three defending 1960 titleholders won again, Elliott Simons of Lock Haven State College (Pa.) repeated as 115-pound champion and was named outstanding wrestler in the tournament by a vote of coaches. Others successfully defending crowns were Larry Hayes, Iowa State (147) and heavyweight Dale Lewis of Oklahoma. Hayes had won at 137 in 1959, 147 in 1960.

Pittsburgh's Larry Lauchle, runner-up last year at 130, went all the way this time, trouncing David Jensen of Iowa State Teachers, 7-0. Repeat runners-up were Dick Wilson, Toledo (115) and Masaaki Hatta, Oklahoma State (123).

Oklahoma State's Ted Ellis, heavyweight kippin in 1959, lost a close 3-2 decision to Lewis in the Corvallis finals. For the winning Cowboys, Phil Kinyon at 157 and Bob Johnson at 177 were the only individual titlists. Oklahoma's two victors were Duwane Miller (123) and Lewis. But it was in overall depth that Coach Myron Roderick's talent-laden squad overwhelmed the field.

Oregon State produced its first NCAA individual champion when Don Conway beat Bruce Campbell of Oklahoma State for the 167-pound gonfalon. The Beavers almost got another as Ron Finley lost in the last 10 seconds to Michigan State's Norman Young, 5-2.

Colorado State College got a winner as Len Lordino decisioned Nick Kohls of Colorado State University, 4-0.

Attendance was disappointing as only 6445 fans were on hand for the three-day affair. Student support was lacking because of spring vacation, but facilities at 11,000-seat Gill Coliseum were termed "excellent" by coaches and participants.

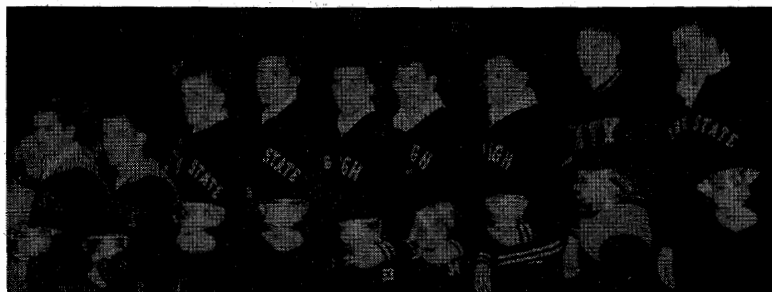

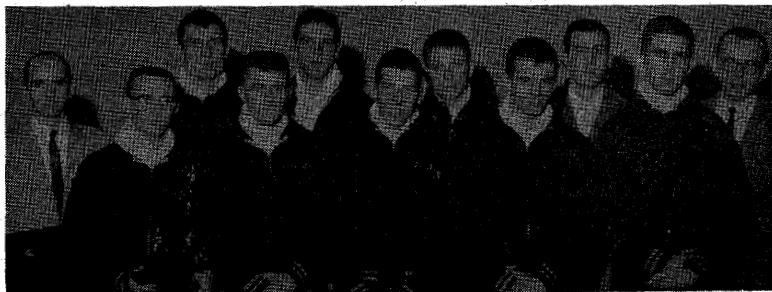

COLLEGIATE REVIEWS

Eastern Intercollegiate Wrestling Association

Lehigh annexed its fifteenth EIWA Championship last March with a record score of 88 points. Pittsburgh and Penn State, the 1960 co-champions, placed second and third, respectively.

Penn State and Lehigh each captured three individual titles while Pitt won two and Navy one. Penn State leads with 78 individual titles in the fifty-seven-year history of the EIWA, Lehigh is second with 75, and Cornell third, with 74.

Successful heavyweight defender Johnston Oberly of Penn State won the John A. Fletcher Memorial Award for the most points (42) in EIWA competition in 1959-60-61 and Lehigh's talented captain and star, Turner, was selected by the coaches as the tournament's outstanding wrestler. The Coaches Association presented silver bowls to Charles Moravec, former director of sports publicity at Lehigh; and three retiring coaches—Richard C. Waite of Columbia, Charles Ridenour of Pennsylvania, and Raymond H. Swartz of Navy. The Officials Association also honored John Engel, former president and chief referee of the EIWA, with a silver trophy for his ten years of service as EIOWA president.

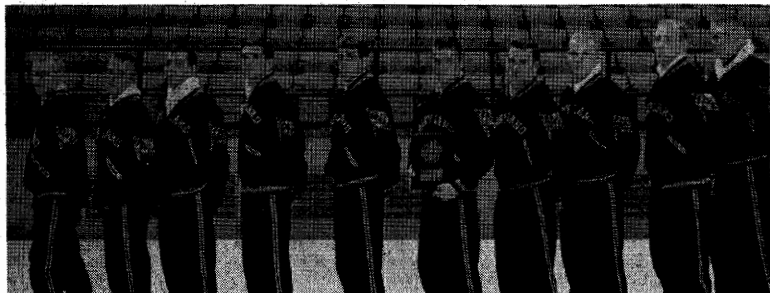

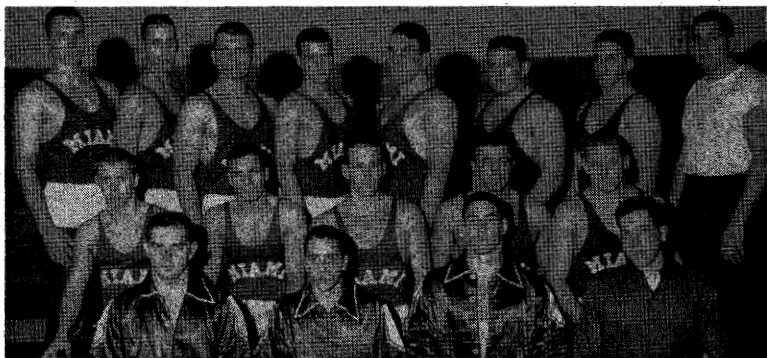

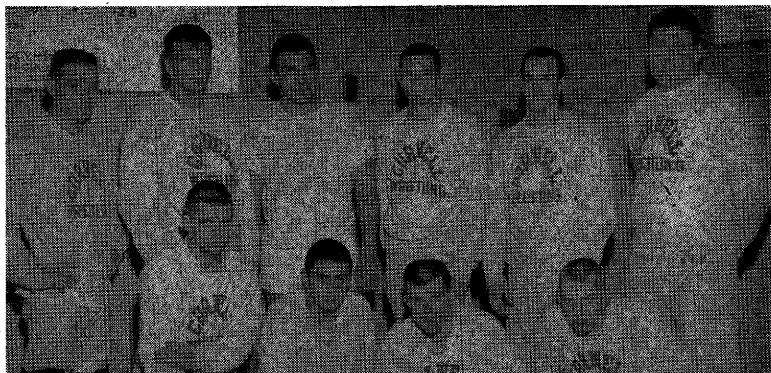

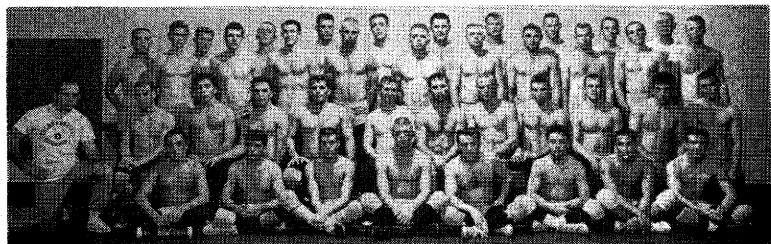

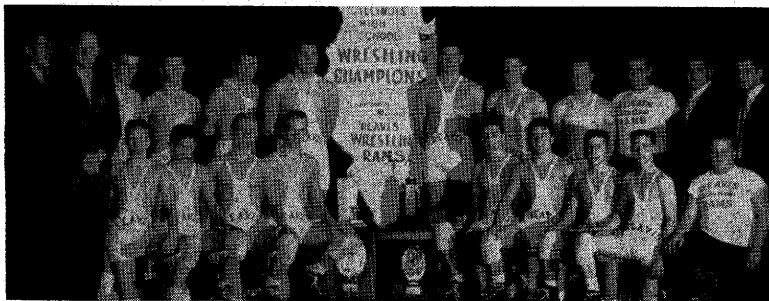

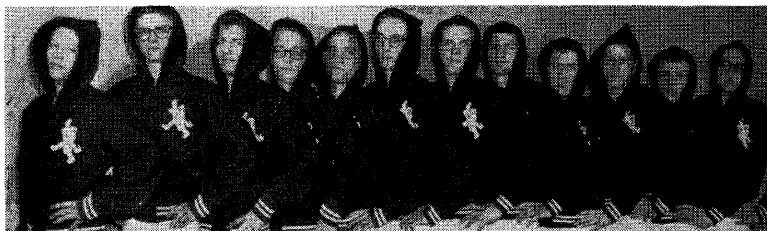

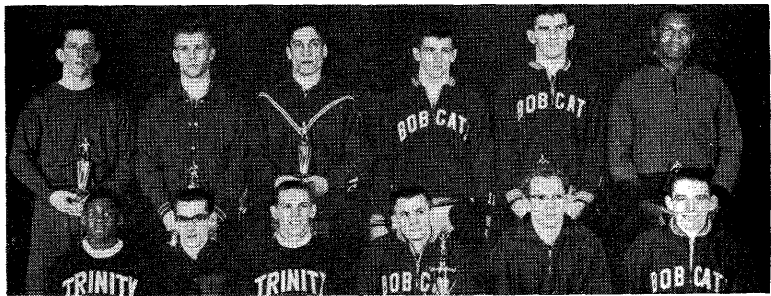

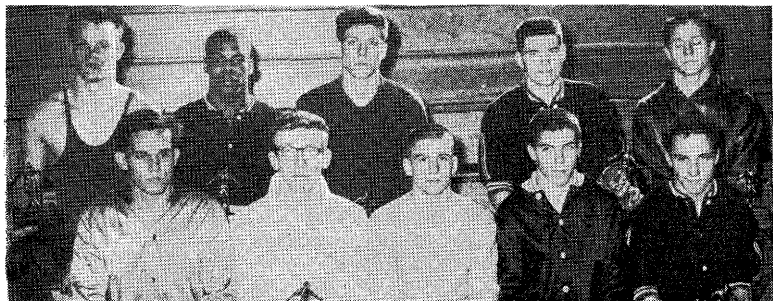

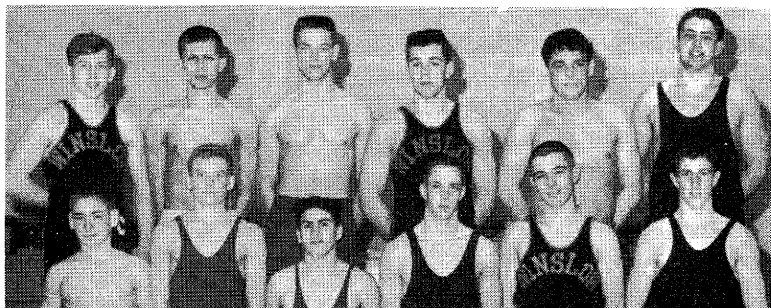
